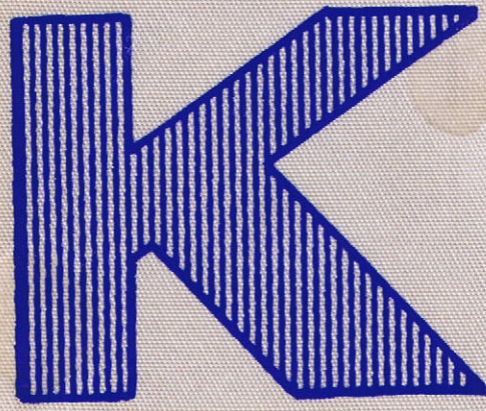
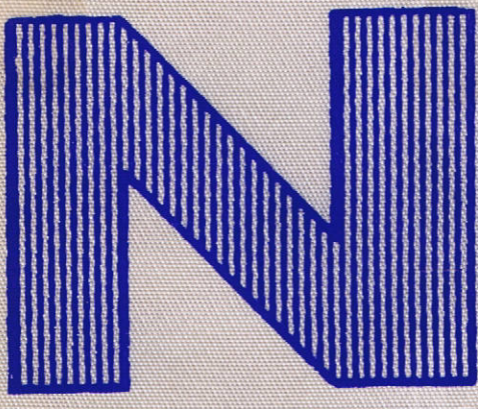
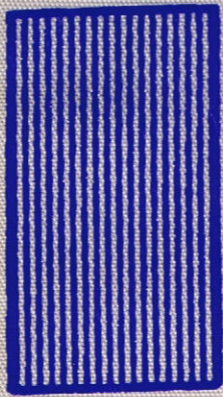

MacArthur Beats Austin

It upset the MacArthur Brahmas tremendously that they lost their season opener with Churchill last Friday.

This was evident Saturday night as the wild bulls crushed a respected Austin Austin squad, 38-12, at North East Stadium to brighten the self respect dimmed in the opener.

The Brahmas' 426-yard offense was a balanced affair as runningbacks Danny Armstrong and George Henderson led the rushers to a 293-yard reading while quarterback Brad Wheelless got most of the 133 passing.

Armstrong, a 205-pound fullback, took over the Alamo City rushing leadership with a 119-yard performance and a total of 213 yards. Henderson added in 102 yards on only eight carries.

Wheelless, not hampered by bad weather as in the opener, hit on five of nine tosses for 126 yards.

The Maroons, who opened the game strong, collected 231 yards, with 187 on the ground.

Austin got on the board first after recovering a MacArthur fumble on the Brahma 46. It took the visitors nine plays to score on a 22-yard pass from quarterback Wally Scott to fullback Scott Jamail.

MacArthur came back to tie it two plays after the kickoff as Henderson broke over left tackle on a 66-yard scoring dash with 5:03 remaining in the initial period.

Austin then took the kickoff and drove 74 yards in 10 snaps for its final score of the game with 39 seconds remaining in the

first quarter. Tailback John Pearce, who paced the Maroon attack with 74 yards on 20 assignments, scored from the 1.

All three point-after attempts in the period were aborted.

On the final play of the quarter Armstrong burst over left guard for 67 yards before being dragged down at the 1. He scored from there on the first play of the second period and the score was tied 12-12.

Don Giles intercepted an Austin pass to give Mac the ball on the 29. The drive took four plays with Armstrong going the final three yards with 2:02 remaining in the half. Armstrong converted.

The Brahmas went 64 yards in 12 plays to score in the third quarter on a one-yard plunge by Armstrong with 6:22 remaining.

The Brahmas' two fourth-period touchdowns came on 30-yard pass interception return by Fred Hudson and a 15-yard run by Armstrong. Jeff Large toed the PAT after Hudson's score.

Tackle John Snell recorded MacArthur's fumble recovery while Kevin Vinal, who also caught four passes, got the other Brahma interception.
