Passes Put MacArthur Over 28-to-9 Winner

SAN MARCOS — MacArthur, holding a slim 13-9 edge after three quarters, got a pair of touchdown passes from quarterbacks Brad Wheels and William Thrasher in the final 12 minutes to score a 28-9 District 29-AAAA football victory over host San Marcos Friday night.

The victory was the fifth against four losses and a tie for the Brahmas, and gave them a 2-2-1 district mark. San Marcos finished its season with a 5-5 slate, and a 2-3 loop record.

Wheels and Thrasher fired their scoring passes to split end Kevin Binall. Wheels' pass was good for six yards, while the Thrasher-to-Binall play covered 52 yards.

122 POINTS FOR YEAR

City scoring leader Danny Armstrong put the Brahmas on the scoreboard first early in the second quarter when he capped a 53-yard drive with a three-yard run. Armstrong also kicked the extra point, his first of two for the game, to give him 122 points for the season.

Armstrong scored 17 touchdowns and kicked 20 conversions for the season.

San Marcos, however, tied the score just before the end of the half when tailback Cecil Burleson scored from the three to cap a 61-yard march. Ed Tisdell kicked the point after.

George Henderson, the game's leading rusher, scored what proved to be the winning touchdown early in the third quarter when he ran 66 yards to give Mac a 13-7 lead. Henderson picked up 138 yards on only eight carries to lead all ball carriers.

FUMBLE ON 4

San Marcos threatened to tie

the game again the next time it had the football, but a fumble at the Mac 4 killed the Rattlers' hopes. Thea Rattlers did get some consolation points, however, when Barry Adair tackled Brian Compton in the end zone for a safety as the latter tried to run outside his right end.

The Rattlers also had a 52-yard touchdown run in the third quarter by Tisdell nullified because of a holding penalty.

Wheels and Thrasher took over after that to insure the Brahmas' victory. Jeff Large accounted for the Brahmas' scoring

when he ran for the conversion following the final touchdown.

Tisdell led San Marcos ball carriers with 76 yards on 16 carries.
