

Seguin Bops Mac, 12-0

The Seguin Matadors used a hard-hitting defense and a bruising ground game to grind

under the MacArthur Brahmas 12-0 in a District 29-AAAA battle Saturday night at North East Stadium.

The victory left the Matadors tied at the top of the district heap with Roosevelt with a 3-0 mark, whi

a 3-0 mark, while the Brahmas skidded to 0-2-1.

Seguin used two long marches to put its points on the scoreboard. Fullback Sherman Wilson plunged three yards for one tally and quarterback Alvin Schuerg pushed one yard for the other.

The contest was actually settled in the trenches where the Matador down-men all but shut off the vaulted Brahma rushing attack and opened crisp holes in the MacArthur line for a bevy of hard-running Seguin backs.

So stout was the Seguin defense that MacArthur managed only 88 yards rushing and ace fullback Danny Armstrong, who had been averaging 123 yards per game and was the district's 1 e a d i n g scorer, got only 46 yards in 14 trips.

sive c h a r g e were linebacker Kevin Monk, end Donald Magin, guard Ronnie Glenewinkel, and tackle Paul Leach.

The Matadors scored the first time they got their hands on the pigskin, rolling 70 yards in 12 plays. With Wilson getting key yardage up the middle and HB Leon Savage picking up 24 on a reverse, the Matadors reached the three, where Wilson plunged over. A kick for the extra point sailed wide.

The Matadors iced the game early in the fourth period with an 80 yard push, sparked by Schuerg and HB Ray Davis, that took 20 plays. Schuerg got the counter on a 1-yard plunge, but was stopped short on a run for the extra points.

So tight was the Seguin defense that MacArthur had only two real scoring chances all night. In the second period guard Tom Tindall grabbed a Matador fumble at the Seguin 20, but on the next play Armstrong was racked hard and fumbled it right back with guard Alvin Goode falling on it for the Matadors.
