But, students, bravely onward we go — ours is not to reason why . . . . .

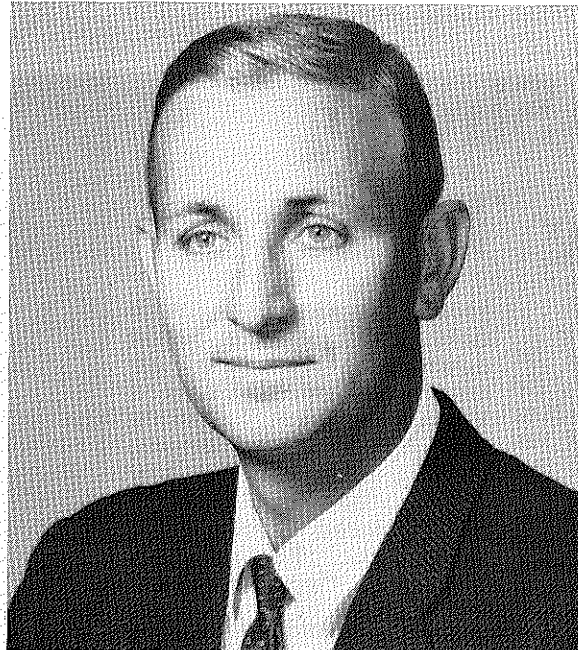


MR. VAKEY prepares for Port Aransas Splash Day in back-yard pool.

Simply because the head football coach, Mr. Fox, decided that in order to have a better football team next year, he would extend the regular two week long spring training session to a lengthy six weeks.

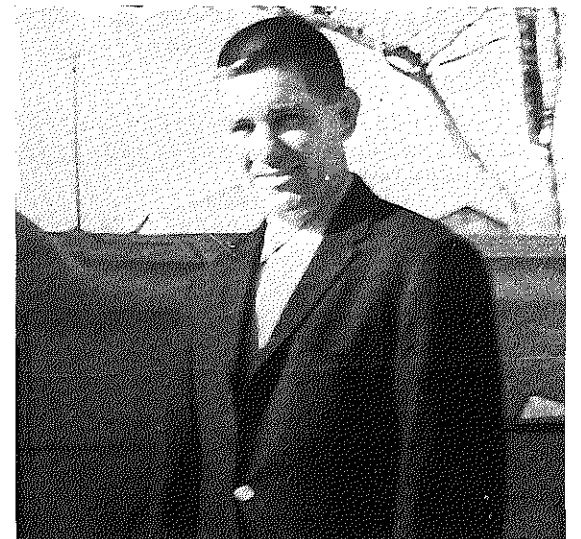
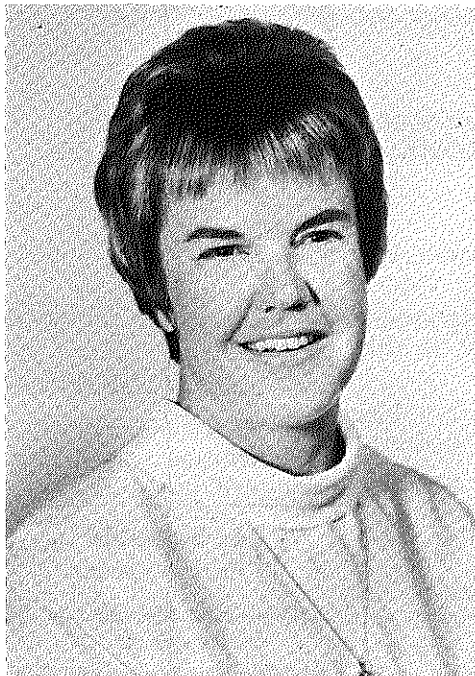
