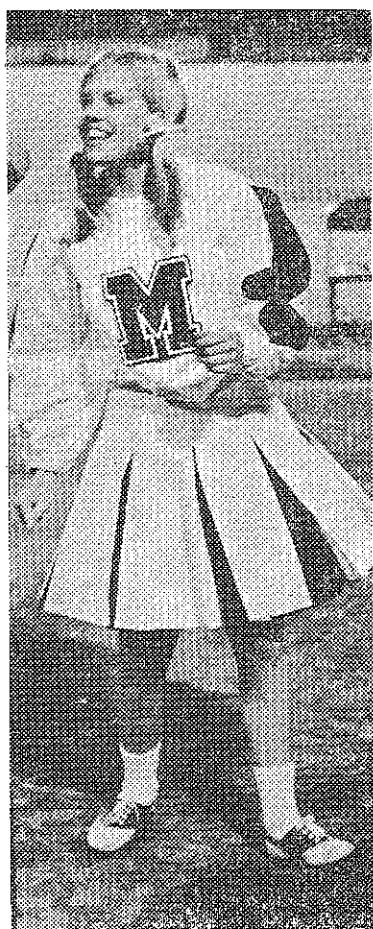
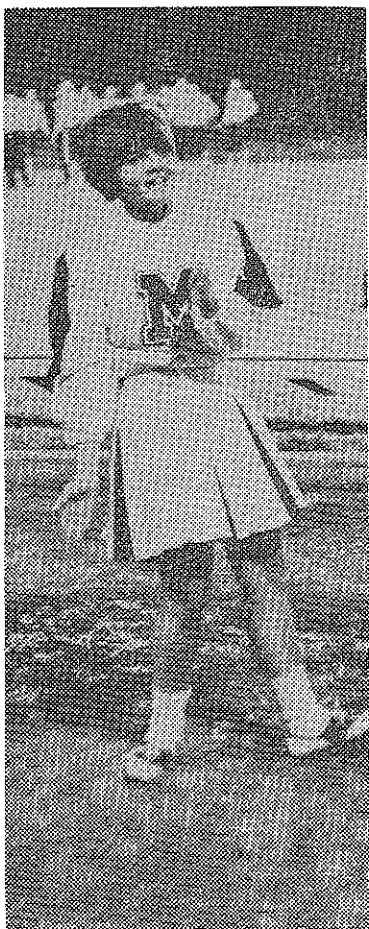


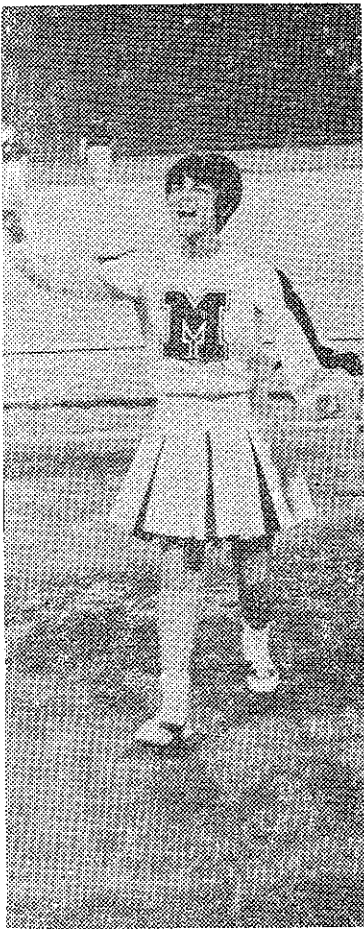

Brahmas to Clash with Jeff

An explosive offense and a stalwart defense has rolled the Blue Wave to a 5-0 season record, and a 2-0 district record. The Blue has 165 points to their opponent's 28 points this season. In two district games the Brahmas have scored 90 points and allowed only 9.

The boys responsible for the

success of the backs are the line-men but the players who ring up the points are:

Mike McLeod—Six touchdowns, 258 yards rushed, number one scorer in 15-AAAA.

Rocky Self—Five touchdowns, 157 yards rushed, 298 yards passing, second leading scor-

er in district.

Al Hook—Two touchdowns, 251 yards rushed.

Dutch Riefler—Four touchdowns, 165 yards rushed.

Chuck Dannis—Three touchdowns, nine pass receptions.

Jon Ylitalo—One touchdown, 17 extra points.

Tuesday Macsters walked the campus in artfully decorated socks, honoring the theme of Stomp 'Em Day.

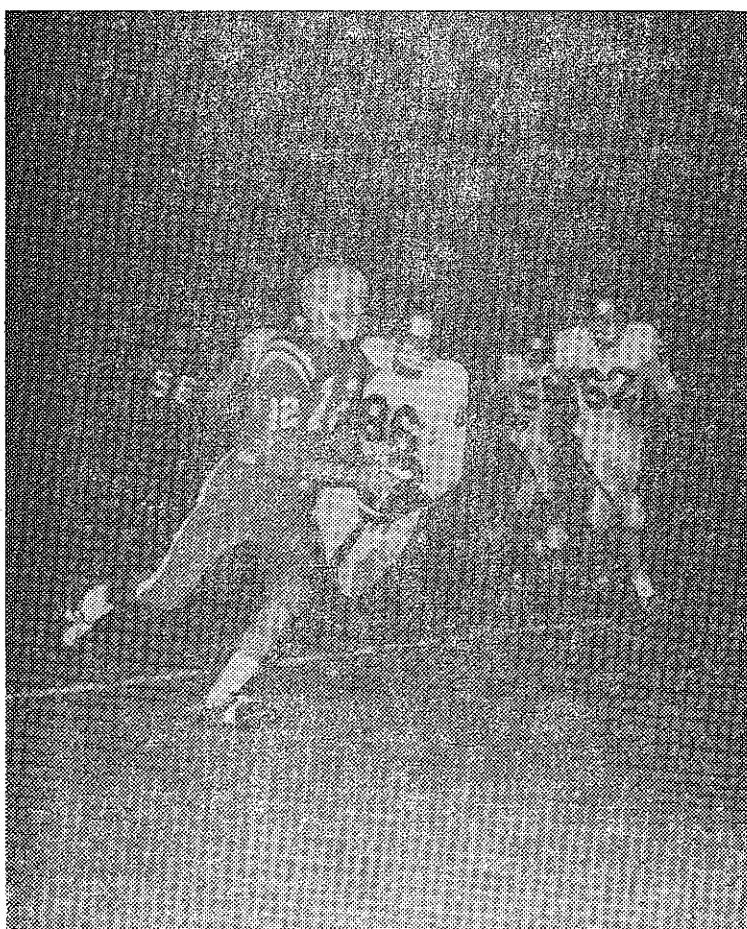

Brahmas Beat Mules For 5-0 Standing

The MacArthur Brahmas showed power and spirit in a come from behind victory, 35-9, over Alamo Heights last Friday night in Blossom Stadium. The Brahmas were stunned when the Mules scored on their first offensive play of the night. Back James Riley of Heights broke through tackle and out-sprinted the secondary on a 62 yard scoring jaunt. George Grieder was wide left with the extra point try.

The Brahmas recovered quickly by taking the next kickoff and marching 77 yards to score on fullback Dutch Reifler's four yard plunge. The Mules then drove deep into Mac territory before the Brahma defense stiffened. George Grieder hit a 33 yard field goal for the Mules in a fourth and eight situation.

The Brahmas took the next kickoff and went 77 yards to score on a one yard keeper by quarterback Rocky Self. Dutch Reifler's recovery of a Heights fumble on MacArthur's three yard line killed a long Mule drive.

Playing it safe, the Brahmas pulled a surprise third down punt. Jon Ylitalo, with the help of a strong wind, booted the ball 78 yards from scrimmage to the Heights 14 yard stripe. Two plays later defensive back Jeff Davis recovered a fumble to set up Mac's third TD. Rocky Self hit end Chuck Dannis with a bullet pass worth 24 yards and the score.

After a scoreless third quarter, Mac halfback Al Hook climaxed a long drive by slamming over from the five yard marker. Following still another long drive, the Big Blue put their last points on the scoreboard when halfback Mike McLeod went over the goal line from one yard out. Jon Ylitalo added his fourth straight extra point of the night.

While there were so many stars for MacArthur that the win was a true team effort, tackle Dickie Thomas was a standout on defense. The Brahmas had their first opportunity to show that they can come from behind and they made the most of it with their resounding win.
