




the most highly decorated officers in the history of the U.S. His awards included the Congressional Medal of Honor, the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Distinguished Service Cross with Oak leaf clusters, the Purple Heart with oak leaf cluster, the Silver Star with six oak leaf clusters, the Distinguished Service Medal from the U.S. Navy, Bronze Star Medal, U. S. Air Medal, as well as highest honors and decorations from seventeen foreign countries.

It is generally agreed the General possesses one of the most outstanding military records in modern times and that his military genius has few peers in history. General MacArthur also held numerous honorary degrees from colleges and universities throughout the U.S. and foreign countries.
